National Landmark Garden



The National Landmark Garden in Nay Pyi Taw is a model in miniature of the states and regions of Myanmar. Situated on a 400 acre plot near Thaik-Chanug Village in Zeyarthiri Township. The garden showcases scaled-down versions of the country's most famous attractions, such as the Shwe Dagon Pagoda in Yangon, Golden Rock Pagoda in Mon State, Mt. Khakaborazi in Kachin State, Ngapali Beach in Rakhine State and Inlay Lake in Shan State.

The zoo covers about 500 acres and just off the Yangon - Mandalay Highway. It is home to 430 animals, representing 81 species.

For the public reverence, replica Buddha Gaya, Thatta Thattaha Maha Bawdi Pagoda (162 ft) is being built on the Udayayanthi Hillock in Pohbathiri Township.

As well as the variety of places to visit in the vast area of the city just some ten to twenty minutes' drive from Nay Pyi Taw are the old towns of Pynmana and Lewa, these have a wealth of treasures to explore; bustling markets, pagodas and beautiful teak monasteries.

Myanmar International Convention Center



For those interested in architecture, several of the government buildings are worth of visit. There are two Myanmar International Convention Centres; the first one was completed on 15th March, 2010 and the new one was launched on 4th January, 2014. Due to the series of reforms, there are many state occasions and business events holding at the respective hotels and Myanmar International Convention Centres in Nay Pyi Taw. The Hluttaw or Parliament complex is made up of 31 buildings, with the Presidential Palace nearby. The City Hall built in the same style, though not so ornate, is close.

Restaurants

Many Kinds of restaurants are open daily in Nay Pyi Taw. Chinese Food, Thai Food, European Food and Myanmar Food are available at these restaurants. Hill Top Restaurants are situated near Myoma Market.

The Defence Services Museum

The Defence Services Museum is built on an area of 603.68 acres in Zeyarthiri Township. There are six booths of the Army, three booths of the Navy and three booths of the Air Force and one Guest Lounge for each of the Army, Navy and Air Force. There are also rest halls with restaurants and souvenir shops. The Defence Services Museum (Nay Pyi Taw) is opened with a view to enable youth and people to learn the independence struggles, historic battles and actions of the Armed Forces since its birth in 1945 till now and imbuing them with the spirit to safeguard the independence.

Nay Pyi Taw, The New Administrative Capital

Nay Pyi Taw is the new administrative capital of the Republic of the Union of Myanmar. Centrally located, it is 391 km from Yangon and 302 km from Mandalay, Nay Pyi Taw comprises of (8) townships; Zeyarthiri, Pohbathiri, Ottarithiri, Zabuthiri, Dekkhinathiri, Pynmana, Lewa and Tatkone Townships.

Getting to Nay Pyi Taw

Nay Pyi Taw International airport is about 30 minutes drive from Nay Pyi Taw. All domestic carriers operate daily flight from Nay Pyi Taw to Yangon, the commercial city and Mandalay, the cultural city. There are flights via Nay Pyi Taw to tourist destinations such as Bagan, Heho, Sittaw, Myitkyina, Kyaing Tong, Tachileik and others. Now, Bangkok Airways is operating direct flights to Nay Pyi Taw from Monday to Friday.

Many modern highway buses operate daily from several cities to and from Nay Pyi Taw. Visitors Can reach Nay Pyi Taw not only by air but also directly by coach and by train from many

The Waunna Theikdi Stadium is the biggest Stadium in Myanmar. It has capacity of 30,000 spectators. We have successfully hosted opening and closing ceremonies of 27th South East Asian Games in Dec 2013 and 7th ASEAN Para Games in Jan 2014 in this Stadium.

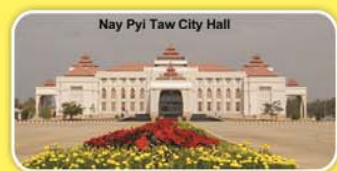
The first impression of the city is the size - huge spaces and huge buildings. The city is now in place; the Government buildings, housing, Schools, hospitals

Uppatasanti Pagoda

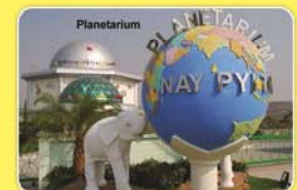

At the Gems Museum, two sculptures of white elephants stand guard outside of the entrance. The ground floor is arranged like a market with variety of jewellery shops. Upstairs is the museum which houses some amazing large stones and crafted pieces. Nay Pyi Taw is now hosting the annual Gems Emporium.

Nay Pyi Taw is well catered with public gardens: the Jade Garden, the Water Fountain Garden. Zoological Garden, Safari Wildlife Park, National Herbal Garden and the National Landmark Garden are some attractions to be explored in and around the capital. Every one of these gardens is a worth of visit and water fountain is open at night with attractive lighting.



National Museum (Naypyitaw)

It is Located on Yaza Thingaha road, near the Kumudra circle, Ottarithiri township. Total plot area is 14.08 Hectore. There has five main buildings such as A, B, C, D and E. In the buildings A, Mini Theatre, VIP holding rooms, President's Gifts Exhibition Room and Public area are included. The rest of the building is the display area. In building B, the display areas are divided into Primate and Fossil Exhibition Room, Prehistoric Period Exhibition Room, Proto Historic Period Exhibition Room, Historic Period (11th - 14th Century AD) Exhibition Room, Myanmar Art Gallery and Myanmar Performing Art Exhibition Room. In the Building C, D, E are still displayed about the history and the cultural heritage of Myanmar to be a national Level Museum.
