### Entrance Building (Building A)

This building has the big Auspicious Bowl and the wall that consists of (92) kinds of wood in Myanmar. It is the place where the gurd of honor is given in front the main entrance building, photos are taken at the grand flight of steps and other buildings can be reachd through the reception hall.



### Amyotha Hluttaw Building (Building J)

Building J has a session hall that can hold 477 persons, 3 meeting rooms, a dining room, a cafeteria, snack rooms, two porticos that can be used as entrance or exit.



### Functional Building (Building E&E annex)

At Building E&E annex, there is a call room for superiors, a press room, a multipurpose hall, lounges for superiors, waiting rooms for superiors' retinue, coffee rooms and dining rooms.



### Pyidaungsu Hluttaw Building (Building D)

Building D contains a session hall that can hold 1258 persons for holding Pyidaungsu sessions 798 seats in the main session hall and 460 seats for observers, totaling 1258 seats.



### Banquet Building (Building B)

Building B contains dining tables for 1000 persons, lounges for VIPs, waiting rooms for superiors, healthcare units, stage for entertainment. The Theatre Building can be reached through the corridor.



### Pyithu Hluttaw Building (Building C)

Building C contains a session hall that can hold 1292 persons for holding Pyithu Hluttaw sessions 808 seats in the main session hall and 484 seats for observers, totaling 1292 seats.

### Theater Building (Building F)

Building contains an auditorium which can hold 1247 people. It can hold a large number of performers, It has enough rooms for dancers and performers to take a rest in private and from this building. There is a direct access to theater directly of go to the Dining Hall Building (B.annex).



### Hluttaw (Parliament)

The parliament building can be observed from the bailey bridge built over the Ngalaik stream. It has (31) buildings built over the (84) acres of Land. There are (10) main buildings, (20) small buildings and corridors.

The main buildings are (1) Entrance Building (Building A) (2) Banquet Building (Building B) (3) Dining Hall (Building B annex) (4) Pyithu Hluttaw Building (Building C) (5) Pyidaungsu Hluttaw Building (Building D) (6) Functional Building (Building E&E annex) (7) Theatre Building (Building F) (8) (9) Special Buildings (Building G & 1G) (10) Amyotha Hluttaw Building (Building J).

The (20) small buildings are Functional Buildings (Building I).



### Nay Pyi Taw

Nay Pyi Taw is the greenest capital, 391 km north of the former capital Yangon and 302 km from Mandalay. It sits at the centre of the country. Nay Pyi Taw comprises (8) townships. Zeyar Thiri, Pohb Ba Thiri, Ut Tara Thiri, Zabu Thiri, Dekkina Thiri, Pyin Mana, Leway and Tat Kone. This new capital built over an area of 7054 square kilometers, has all the ingredients required for a sustainable, competitive international city in the heart of East Asia.

The Greenest City of Nay Pyi Taw has an ideal venue, providing large, modern and efficiently designed Convention Centres for MICE, world-class hotels equipped with a vast array of 5 star facilities expected and required by modern, globetrotting business persons.



### Hluttaw (Parliament)

The Hluttaw or Parliament complex is made up of 31 buildings and situated in the west of the city in Zabu Thiri Township. It is built on an 800 acre site which also includes the Presidential Palace and a beautiful landscape.

Nay Pyi Taw means the Royal City where Myanmar king built the Palace and settled in the Myanmar dynasty. It was built on a plain region which sits between two ranges of hills, Bago Yoma and Shan Yoma and has been beautifully landscaped. There are no traffic jams and air pollution.

The Hluttaw building is grand and highly decorated. Hluttaw is made up of the Amyotha Hluttaw, the Pyithu Hluttaw and Pyidaungsu Hluttaw.



### Pyithu Hluttaw

The Pyithu Hluttaw is formed with Hluttaw representatives elected on the basis of township as well as population and Hluttaw Representatives being the Defence Services personnel nominated by the Commander-in-Chief of the Defence Services. Pyithu Hluttaw Commission serves for Assessment of Legal Affairs and Special Issues.



### Amyotha Hluttaw

The Amyotha Hluttaw has 224 MPs. Among them 75 % are elected persons by voters and 25 % are military personnel appointed by the Commander-in-Chief of the Defence Services.

### Requirements for Visit

Local and foreign visitors are allowed to visit the Parliament Compound with prior permission from the office of the Union Government. Visitors are responsible to apply for the prior permission 3 days ahead before the visit.

### Constitution of Myanmar

The Constitution of the Republic of the Union of Myamar is bicameral system, There are two Houses (Parliament) House of Representatives (Pyithu Hluttaw) and House of Nationalities (Amyotha Hluttaw). Union Assembly (Pyidaungsu Hluttaw) is held by combining the two Houses.

### Pyidaungsu Hluttaw

The Pyidaungsu Hluttaw comprises the Pyithu Hluttaw and the Amyotha Hluttaw. There has 664 Members of Parliament (MPs)..
